Note: There was a minimal increase in monograph circulation during the 2007-2008 fiscal year of 2% . The largest increase posted this year was for the non-circulating books which were all the reference books that were integrated into the third floor stacks. There appears to be a general interest in these titles. A decrease in media usage may be linked to the fact that fewer current and popular titles are being added as well as the fact that the VHS format is not being supported the electronics industry. Simply said, fewer people have VHS machines. Course Reserves experienced a slight decrease but it must be noted that more instructors are transferring more of their materials to the electronic reserves format.
